## Did You Know?

Lyon was named Lugdunum in 43 B.C. Lugdunum means “Hill of Lights.” Jesus called his disciples “the light of the world” (Matthew 5:14). When the people of Lyon turn to Christ, it will truly become a hill of lights!



One woman in France, who has recently made a decision to follow Jesus Christ, has felt drawn to Jesus since she was a child, when she read His Name in a book. She mentioned that when she was 19, she asked a priest for a Bible, and he said he would give her one, if he could find one. He couldn't. Finally, at age 31, she came in contact with believers, and her life has been transformed by the power of God.

1,500,000 people live in or near Lyon. 1,492,500 of them do not have a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. Most of these have **never** heard God's plan of salvation, have **never** seen a Bible, have **never** attended a church service. Can we ignore this need?
