My childhood was filled with anguish. Sexually abused at the age of four, and again at eight, by people who were close to me. I thought it was normal, and that it was truly love. My parents, both alcoholics, divorced when I was one year old. So, I lived with my mother, and my brother lived with my father. My mother married three times afterward, and often had new lovers, which meant that we never stayed anywhere for long, and moved almost every year.

I fell into a very deep depression. That's when I met some Muslims. They told me about the Koran and acted very nice to me. I felt loved. These Muslims tried to convince me that I had everything wrong! And the worst thing was that I believed them!


One day I went to a mosque with a Muslim friend. It was the time for me to say the words to become a Muslim. They gave me some pages with words from the Koran. At that moment, my heart trembled. I didn't know any more what was true. I dropped the pages and went home.

I telephoned my brother to tell him what had happened to me. My brother told me simply, "Listen, Angelique, ask the God of Truth to answer you. And He will tell you the truth, you can be sure of it.

"So that's what I did. I got on my knees, I cried, and I begged God to tell me the truth about Jesus. At that moment, an incredible Peace entered me. And then, I knew that my heart knew the truth! Jesus is really the Son of God! Since that day, I follow the Lord Jesus Christ. He is my Savior and Lord. He died for me on the cross. He is alive, because God raised Him from the dead!
