And behold, an employee insisted on helping with his forklift, getting an hour's work done in ten minutes! The kids were overjoyed to see their toys again – Jonathan was ecstatic when he rediscovered his stuffed tiger!



Blessings in Hilversum!!!!

Great news! The church we helped to plant in Hilversum has been meeting for five years in a building slated for imminent demolition. Because of this, the church has been able to use the building, which is owned by the city of Hilversum, rent-free! The plans for the demolition have just been cancelled, so the church will be able to continue using the building for some time to come! And now they are considering the possibility of purchasing the property.
